

House Training



Be Prepared

Puppies will have accidents.

Consider using a crate or section off an area that is easy to clean. Generally puppies tend not to mess where they sleep, so a crate can be especially useful during the night.

Rewarding

What gets rewarded, gets repeated.

Let your puppy know when they have got it right by marking the behaviour and giving them a tasty treat. Add a cue word when they do go and soon they will be able to toilet on cue.

Predict

Predict when your puppy needs to go out.

Your puppy will need to go out after playing, after sleeping, after eating or drinking, after play or any form of excitement, if sniffing or going around in circles.

It can take time for your puppy to master house training. Please don't punish them. Be patient if they get it wrong, simply clean it up and be more prepared next time.
